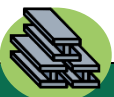
Major Industrial highlights of the week:

There were very few noteworthy industrial developments during **29 June–5 July 2026**. Much of the reporting focused on routine market updates and performance indicators rather than transformational events, making it a comparatively quiet week for Pakistan's industrial landscape. The standout development, however, was Pakistan's commitment to establish the national chapter of the Apparel and Textile Transformation Initiative (ATTI), marking a significant milestone in the country's industrial decarbonization and sustainable manufacturing journey.

- Pakistan became the third country globally to join the Apparel and Textile Transformation Initiative (ATTI), committing to develop a national transformation plan focused on decarbonization, energy efficiency, water stewardship, climate finance, and sustainable manufacturing, while providing practical support to textile SMEs.
- SAARC CCI strengthened industrial and trade engagement with China, highlighting continued efforts to expand regional business cooperation and investment opportunities.
- Pakistan's cement sector showed signs of recovery, although analysts noted that growth remains below the pace required for sustained industry expansion.
- Cement dispatches increased by 7.2%, reaching 50.5 million tonnes in FY26, indicating improving domestic demand and export performance compared to the previous year.
